COURSE LOADS: Maximum of 17 credits allowed for all semesters. Additional course loads are allowed for students who achieve Dean's List. Consult the catalogue for details on the Dean's List privilege.

ADMISSION TO UPPER DIVISION REQUIREMENTS:

- A student must apply for upper division status in the second semester of the sophomore year (November 15 in Fall semester; April 15 in Spring semester). In order to be granted upper division status:
- The student must supply 3 recommendations, one from his/her Advisor and the remaining 2 from Accounting/Business faculty.
 - The student must complete the Request for Upper Division form.
 - Minimum grades of C must be achieved in the following: ACC225; ACC226; BA211; BA220; CMP101; ECO201; ECO202; MGQ221; MGQ222; MGT208; MIS280; MIS290; MKT209.
 - The student must have an overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.50.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

- In addition to those courses referenced under the Admission to Upper Division Requirements, minimum grades of "C" must be achieved in the following: BA350; FIN325; MGT321 **AND** all courses in the specialization.
- An overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.00

PROGRAM NOTES:

A. COOP FIELD EXPERIENCE: Three (3) credits are required and may be taken in either Year 3 (2nd semester) or Year 4 (either semester). Requirements for participation in Coop are: successful completion of CFE97 Coop Prep Seminar (0 credits); **and** a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 **and** permission of the student's Advisor. Consult the Coop Department for further details on requirements for participation.

B. MTH131: Students will complete one of the following courses: MGQ360 or MGQ427 or MTH102 or MTH131. **Students planning to pursue a graduate degree in Business are advised to take MTH131.** Depending upon Math background, a student may be required to complete lower-level Math courses before enrollment in MTH131. Therefore, students who must take additional math courses are encouraged to begin math studies as early as possible.

C. STUDENTS PURSUING THE INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS SPECIALIZATION: Foreign Language Requirement: Students in the International Business specialization must demonstrate proficiency in a foreign language at the intermediate level by passing an approved proficiency exam. Depending upon any previous preparation in a foreign language, a sequence of course work may be recommended.

LANGUAGE PLACEMENT GUIDELINES: Students will be placed in courses in language studies as follows:

- Placement in course #101: No previous language experience or only 1 year of high school language study
 - Placement in course #102: Credit for #101 or 2 years of high school language study
 - Placement in course #105: Credit for 102 or 3-4 years of high school language study
 - Placement in course #106: 4+years of high school language study
 - Placement in 200-level courses or above: 4+ years of high school language study
- NOTE:** If a student has 4+ years of high school language (or is a native/heritage speaker) and does not wish to continue language classes, he/she should take the first available proficiency exam or see a Foreign language department member.

D. PREREQUISITE STUDIES: As in all majors, all prerequisites for courses in the program must be satisfied.
