Dear Students,

As you know, Daemen has been working incredibly hard to meet our main goal of getting students back on campus safely during this current crisis. We have been following all of the guidelines outlined by the college's Emergency Response Team (ERT) to ensure lower density in classrooms, the mandatory wearing of PPE, and keeping people physically distant. At the same time, we have ensured the curriculum will still satisfy your academic needs set in a campus-based experience.

We know that this is all a little different, but we believe we have a good plan that will ensure our on-campus students receive their education while giving Daemen the best chance of preventing an outbreak. In juggling all of those variables, along with other restraints, the fall 2020 schedule is complete. Please carefully review the information below.

All changes are now available in Self Service. Please review your fall 2020 registration:

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Example comments you can expect are the following:

Hybrid with “This class will meet in person until the Thanksgiving break. Further details will be provided by your instructor.” This will inform you that your instructor is following a face-to-face model until Thanksgiving break.

Hybrid with “You will meet in-person/remote on alternate days until Thanksgiving break. Further details will be provided by your instructor.” This will inform you that your instructor is following a low-density model and utilizing both remote and in-classroom delivery.

Online with “This class is Online Synchronous, it will meet on scheduled dates and times remotely. Further details will be provided by your

instructor.” This will inform you that your instructor is following a Synchronous remote model that has expected dates and times for you to engage with the course and instructor.

Online with “This class is Online Asynchronous, the content will be shared remotely not necessarily at a set day and time. Further details will be provided by your instructor.” This will inform you that your instructor is following an Asynchronous model and that the content will be shared with you by your instructor but not on a set schedule.

Course Description	Fulfills core competency: Contextual Integration. The two-course world history sequence focuses on the peoples, forces and ideas that have shaped the way individuals have experienced (and still do experience) the world. The course's perspective is global and focuses on the origins and development, geographical context, and interactions of world cultures. In this course, we will focus on two key themes of early world history: 1) the ways in which different cultures emerged in response to the demands of their environmental surroundings; and 2) the ways in which different peoples began to increasingly interact with one another by 1500. .
