Mission:

The Daemen College ABA Program advances the field of behavior analysis to improve lives through education, research, and promotion of ethical, evidence-based practices.

Definition of Applied Behavior Analysis:

"A Licensed Behavior Analysts designs, implements and evaluates environmental modifications, using behavioral stimuli and consequences, to produce socially significant improvement in human behavior, including the use of direct observation, measurement, and functional analysis of the relationship between environment and behavior." (New York State Education Department – Office of Professions).

A Word from the Program Director:

"This is an exciting opportunity for students interested in working with people with Autism Spectrum Disorders and for pursuing a career as a Behavior Analyst in Western New York. Graduates of the program will be eligible to apply for licensure in New York State as a Licensed Behavior Analyst without the need to complete any additional coursework. Once a license in behavior analysis is obtained, the practitioner can provide behavior analytic services for people with autism spectrum disorders or related disorders."

Applied Behavior Analysis Program Outline:

- Evening classes are geared toward the working professional.
- Courses will include didactic, interactive, and clinical components, and will be delivered on Daemen's main campus in multiple formats including traditional classroom instruction infused with interactive activities.
- Can be completed in two years.
- Both programs feature the NYSED required practicum that includes 150 hours of supervised clinical work under the direction of a Licensed Behavior Analyst.
- Daemen's program is both NYS Registered and BACB VCS.

- Following completion of the program, graduates will be eligible to apply for licensure in New York State as a Licensed Behavior Analyst and to the Behavior Analyst Certification Board TM (BACB) as a Board Certified Behavior Analyst.

Demand for behavior analyst positions **more than doubled between** 2012 (1,414 postings) and 2014 (3,083 postings). This is a national trend, as demand increased in almost every state.



What to Expect in the Field of Applied Behavior Analysis

According to an analysis conducted by the Bureau of Labor Statistics in May of 2017, New York State employs 11,230 Applied Behavior Analysts. The average hourly wage is \$43 per hour and the average salary wage is \$89,430 for an Applied Behavior Analyst.
