The Bachelor of Fine Arts in Sculpture is for individuals who are interested in a vigorous exploration of the plastic arts to create a three-dimensional body of work.

Students in this major take extensive courses in art history, design, drawing, and introductory courses in sculpture to lay foundation for the development of a personal body of work both conceptually and formally informed. Sculpture majors also engage in internships, gallery exhibits, and public works in preparation for finding practical applications for painting beyond the studio.

This major teaches students how to think creatively for themselves and prepares them for a lifelong engagement with the world of art.
