EPA extended the deadline for comments on the [Draft National Strategy to Prevent Plastic Pollution](#) to **July 31, 2023**. Submit your comments [through the docket by clicking here](#). EPA is seeking public comment from a broad array of organizations engaged in post-consumer materials management and infrastructure including state, tribal, territorial, and local governments; industry; researchers; academia; non-profit organizations; community groups; and international organizations. Comments will inform the Agency's efforts to finalize the strategy and work with organizations to implement the actions.

DEC Launches New York Harmful Algal Blooms Notification and Reporting System

DEC and the NYS Department of Health have started the 2023 online New York Harmful Algal Bloom System (NYHABS) interactive map. DEC is asking the public and trained algal bloom samplers to send reports of HABs with photos electronically via a [simple, mobile phone-friendly form](#). Once evaluated by DEC and DOH, reports are posted to the [NYHABS page](#) providing easy access to inform the public about HAB locations in New York. Most algae blooms are harmless. However, exposure to toxins and other substances from certain HABs can make people and animals sick. HABs have been monitored closely across New York State since 2012. DEC's Division of Water recently published an analysis of HABs titled: "[Detections of cyanobacteria harmful algal blooms \(cyanoHABs\) in New York State, United States \(2012–2020\)](#)."

Environmental Working Group Provides List of Verified Sunscreens

While sunscreens protect us from damaging UV rays, they can also expose us to harmful chemicals. Oxybenzone, a hormone-disrupting sunscreen chemical which has been shown to absorb through the skin, has declined in usage due to consumer demand. Legislation to Allow Electronic Repairs.

The [Digital Fair Repair Act](#) is a new law that should make it easier for consumers to repair certain electronic devices, including laptops and smartphones, thereby saving money and reducing harmful e-waste. The law compels manufacturers doing business in the state to make repair parts, tools, and documentation, including schematics, available to the public, something companies had not been required to do in the past. It goes into effect on **July 1, 2023**. This should increase the availability of electronic device repair and bring down prices. Until now, independent repair businesses haven't always had the tools and information they needed to fix broken devices, forcing consumers to go back to the manufacturers for repairs or to just buy replacements. The new law is meant to increase competition for repair work—and let consumers fix their own gadgets if they feel technically capable. The law covers electronic devices purchased at retail, including devices popular with consumers like laptops, smartphones, and tablets. It does not apply to so-called white goods, an industry term that typically refers to big appliances like refrigerators and washing machines.

Amazing New Bioplastic Made from Crab Shells

A new bioplastic has recently been developed made from discarded crab shells, with a bit of wood pulp. This completely compostable film is flexible, transparent, and even suitable for food packaging. Also, its production process doesn't release any harmful toxins, unlike the wasteful process of making plastic. [Read more.](#)

Unique Penn Dixie Finds

An unlikely discovery has been made in Hamburg, New York, and the story has made its way across the nation. This April, two off-duty members of the Penn Dixie educational team, Jonathan Hoag and James Hanna, uncovered the well-preserved remains of a mysterious and exceedingly rare animal – a 'Carpoid' – amongst the rocks at Penn Dixie. The remains represent an entirely new species of primitive Paleozoic echinoderm, previously thought to have gone extinct over 25 million years before the rocks at Penn Dixie were deposited. The Penn Dixie carpoids are a 'Lazarus taxon:' an animal that disappears from the fossil record, then reappears much later. Much like the biblical Lazarus rising from the dead, a Lazarus taxon rises figuratively from the graveyard of global extinction. The coelacanth, a lobe-finned fish which is still found today, is perhaps the most famous example of a Lazarus taxon. [Read more.](#)

DEC reminds boaters to clean, drain, and dry their boats and trailers and disinfect their fishing gear before recreating in New York's waters to prevent the spread of harmful aquatic invasive species (AIS). Watercraft inspection stewards (boat stewards) are deploying across the state to educate and assist the public in cleaning equipment this season to prevent the introduction and spread of non-native plants and animals in New York waterbodies. Have Environmental Concerns? Report Them

The public is invited to report environmental concerns to the U.S. Attorney's Office. Environmental and public health concerns may be about air quality; water pollution; dumping, burying or burning of chemicals or toxic waste; climate change; health; workplace condition; the application of pesticides and their effects on wildlife; wetlands destruction; medications; cosmetics; biological products; oil and chemical spills; and discriminatory environmental and health impacts caused by recipients of federal funds. DEC Pesticide Advice

As of January 1, 2023, DEC reclassified certain neonicotinoid (neonic) pesticide products as "restricted use." Products containing imidacloprid, acetamiprid, and thiamethoxam that are labeled for foliar, widespread outdoor use, and/or seed treatment are no longer permitted to be applied by homeowners. These products contain chemicals like nicotine, and the reclassification was taken to protect New York's environmental resources - especially pollinators. If you are not a certified applicator, the product must be legally disposed of with a certified pesticide applicator or by taking to a Household Hazardous Waste disposal event. . Make Cigarette Butts Part of Your Cleanups

Littered cigarette butts: besides ugly to look at, they are hazardous to our kids, pets, wildlife and gardens. When left in the environment, littered cigarette butts [leach toxic chemicals](#), such as arsenic (used to kill rats) and lead, that may be carried as runoff to drains and end up polluting our rivers and lakes right here in Western New York. Because cigarette butts are primarily made of plastic filters that don't biodegrade, the butts that aren't eaten by wildlife simply pile up on shorelines or at the bottom of bodies of water. DEC's [Great Lakes Program](#) has launched the [New York Great Lakes Shore Viewer](#), an interactive map that allows users to explore approximately 850 miles of New York's Great Lakes shorelines, including Lake Erie, the Niagara River, Lake Ontario, the St. Lawrence River, and many of the larger embayments. The viewer includes coastal oblique aerial imagery of the NY Great Lakes shorelines collected annually by citizen volunteers with the Civil Air Patrol – NY Wing in partnership with the DEC. Routinely updated and publicly accessible coastal oblique imagery is intended to support state resilience programs, promote ecosystem-based shoreline management, and assist with shoreline change monitoring.

Managing New York Forests for Birds

Regenerate NY: \$850,000 in Grants Now Available for Eligible Private Forest Landowners

The 'Regenerate NY' Forestry Cost Share Grant Program is designed to assist private landowners in growing the next generation of forests, which are crucial for mitigating climate change, providing wildlife habitat, protecting air and water quality, and supplying an important renewable resource. Private landowners planning to restore or establish five or more acres of forest land in New York State, may apply for grant awards ranging from a minimum of \$10,000 to a maximum of \$100,000, with a required 25 percent match. Eligible projects include, but are not limited to, planting trees, soil scarification, removing competing vegetation that would interfere with seedling establishment and growth, and installation of deer fence. Applicants must work with a forester or a qualified natural resource professional to develop their project. Applications can be [submitted through the NYS Grants Gateway](#) and will be accepted until 5 p.m. on **Oct. 6, 2023**, or until funds are depleted, whichever comes first. Grants will be awarded on a rolling basis. Applicants need to establish an account in the Grants Gateway System. Once registered, applicants can search the Grants Gateway for "Regenerate NY."

Swallow-wort Biocontrol Release!

WNY PRISM is excited to announce that in early June alongside our partners, NYISRI, CCE-Erie County, Genesee County Park and Forest and Town of Clarence, we released 80 *Hypena opulenta* pupae, the swallow-wort biocontrol agent, at two sites in western New York. We're so excited to work with our partners and volunteers to help monitor and collect important data on these moths! *Hypena opulenta* is a moth that feeds exclusively on the leaves of black and pale swallow-wort. After more than 10 years of research to verify safety to ecosystems, the moth was approved for field release by the USDA in 2017. Read more about swallow-wort biocontrol research [here](#).

AI Allows Trees to “Talk” to Us

Trees have begun to “speak” using new sensors and generative AI. With [ePlant](#)'s new TreeTag, trees are not just silent witnesses to environmental changes anymore; they have become environmental sensors. The TreeTag uses artificial intelligence to present its information in a conversational manner sending data to the cloud. [ChatGPT](#) uses the information to explain a tree's condition through a text conversation with a homeowner or a forestry researcher. The experience is like chatting with a friend, but it might be about how much water the tree needs to be healthy or a report on its growth and the carbon it has captured as it grows. TreeTags are solar-powered, and installation involves placing them onto the side of a tree using a screw. Tree responses are measured using a plunger on the device that rests against the tree bark to detect tiny changes in size that indicate various stresses, such as lack of water. It also includes accelerometers to identify trees at risk of falling and a humidity sensor to capture local weather data. [Read more](#).

Help Track Spotted Lanternfly

[Spotted lanternfly \(SLF\)](#) is an invasive pest that feeds on a variety of plants including grapes, hops and maple trees, posing a severe threat to New York State's forests and agriculture. SLF was first found in PA in 2014, and [several populations have since been found in NY](#), including Buffalo as of September 2022. SLF's preferred host plant, tree-of-heaven (TOH), is already found in many locations across New York State. Help survey for SLF and TOH by picking a location, surveying it 2-3 times throughout 2023 and reporting your observations. WAVE Volunteers Needed

Water Assessments by Volunteer Evaluators (WAVE) is a participatory citizen-based water quality assessment program developed by DEC. Online Tool to View Earth's Changes

Google Earth Engine's new tool, [Dynamic World](#) was built in collaboration with the nonprofit [World Resources Institute](#). Dynamic World pulls from satellite data to create detailed maps in near real-time. It gives users the ability to zoom in on the planet in 10-by-10 meter squares from satellite images collected every two to five days. Artificial intelligence is used to categorize each pixel into nine classes that range from bare ground to trees, crops, and buildings. The tool allows users to explore and track and monitor changes in these terrestrial ecosystems over time.

Clean Energy Educators Institute: Free Training

Public Comment Period to Close July 10 - DEC has released the [Draft Division of Materials Management Program Policy 7](#) - Biosolids Recycling in New York State – Interim Strategy for the Control of PFAS Compounds (DMM7) for a 60-day public comment period. DMM7 establishes interim PFOS and PFOA criteria for biosolids that are recycled in New York State and actions that will be taken by DEC based on those results. This interim policy will remain in place until EPA issues risk-based standards applicable to biosolids that will be recycled, and DEC completes a rulemaking to incorporate those standards, or more stringent standards if deemed appropriate. Persons wishing to comment on DMM7 have the opportunity to *submit written comments until July 10, 2023*. Comments can be submitted by email to OrganicRecycling@dec.ny.gov. Please include "Comments on Draft DMM7" in the subject line of the email.
