Daemen's Nursing RN-BS Program is Flexible for Working Professional Nurses


Scheduling: All nursing courses are offered in an online format, making it possible for you to complete the course in the comfort of your own home, on your own schedule. You can choose to complete the RN to BS program fully online.

All nursing courses are also offered in a hybrid format with five on-campus classes spread over the course of the semester and the rest online. All non-nursing courses are offered either online or in three-hour time blocks one day or evening per week.

Of course, part-time schedules are also available; in fact, each semester the RN meets with a nursing advisor to select the courses which best meet the nurse's needs for the upcoming semester.

Tuition Grants: Generous tuition grants for registered nurses are available, which underwrite 50% of tuition. These grants are not based on financial need, and are guaranteed through completion of BS degree requirements.

Experienced Faculty: All nursing faculty at Daemen have special expertise in teaching and advising adult learners, and are readily available to counsel and support the RN's quest for a BS degree.



Daemen now offers two formats for attaining a BS in Nursing. All classes are offered as totally online or hybrid formats, allowing for greater flexibility.

Admissions Requirements:

Applicants are considered on an ongoing basis. In addition to a completed application, the following are required for admission:

- Official transcripts from previously attended schools, colleges, and/or universities
- Evidence of RN licensure or eligibility to take the RN licensure exam
- Immunization records
